MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

A message from the House of Representatives, by Mr. Overhug, its enrolling clerk, announced that the House had passed a bill (H. R. 2376) to further amend section 848 of the Revised Statutes of the United States, in which it requested the concurrence of the Senate.

The message also announced that the House had passed with an amendment the bill (S. 1084) to provide a national budget system and an independent audit of Government accounts, and for other purposes, requested a conference with the Senate on the bill and amendment, and that Mr. GOOD, Mr. CAMPBELL of Kansas, Mr. MADDEX, Mr. BYRNS of Tennessee, and Mr. GARNER were appointed managers of the conference on the part of the House.

The message further announced that the House had disagreed to the amendment of the Senate to the bill (H. R. 4075) to limit the immigration of aliens into the United States, agreed to the conference requested by the Senate on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses thereon, and that Mr. JOHNSON of

Washington, Mr. STONE, Mr. TERRY, Mr. WALKER, Mr. WOOD, and Mr. WYMAN were appointed managers of the conference on the part of the House.
