AN ACT

Providing for a study regarding the equitable use of the waters of the Rio Grande below Fort Quitman, Texas, in cooperation with the United States of Mexico

- 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the President is hereby authorized to designate three
4 special commissioners to cooperate with representatives of the
5 United States of Mexico in a study regarding the equitable
6 use of the waters of the Rio Grande below Fort Quitman,
7 Texas, with a view to their proper utilization for irrigation
8 and other beneficial uses. One of the commissioners so
9 appointed shall be an engineer experienced in such work.

1 Upon completion of such study the results shall be reported
2 to Congress.

3 SEC. 2. The sum of \$20,000 is hereby authorized to
4 be appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury not
5 otherwise appropriated for carrying out the provisions hereof.
