18 *To defray the cost of representation of the United States*
19 *at the meeting of the Inter-American Committee on Electri-*
20 *cal Communications to be held in Mexico City, Mexico, in*
21 *1924, as authorized by the joint resolution approved April*
22 *28, 1924, including payment of salaries of a secretary and*
23 *other employees, travel and subsistence expenses (notwith-*
24 *standing the provisions of any other Act), and such other*
25 *expenses as the President may deem necessary to the ac-*

1 accomplishment of the purposes expressed in the aforesaid
2 resolution, to be disbursed under the direction and subject to
3 the approval of the Secretary of State, \$30,000, to remain

6 MISCELLANEOUS OBJECTS

7 Investigation and prosecution of war frauds: For
8 the investigation and prosecution of alleged frauds, either
9 civil or criminal, or other crimes or offenses against the
10 United States, growing out of or arising in connection with
11 the preparation for or prosecution of the late war, including
12 the institution and prosecution of suits for the recovery of
13 moneys which contain no element of fraud but arose incident
14 to the investigation of alleged frauds, including the same
15 objects specified under this head in the Act making appro-
16 priations for the Departments of State and Justice and the
17 judiciary for the fiscal year 1924, \$200,000, to remain
18 available until June 30, 1925.

19 UNITED STATES COURTS

20 Salaries, fees, and expenses, United States marshals:
21 For salaries, fees, and expenses of United States marshals
22 and their deputies, including the same objects specified under
23 this head in the Act making appropriations for the Depart-
24 ments of State and Justice and the judiciary for the fiscal
25 year 1924, \$530,000.

1 Salaries and expenses of United States district
2 attorneys: For salaries and expenses of United States district
3 attorneys, including the same objects specified under this
4 head in the Act making appropriations for the Departments
5 of State and Justice and the judiciary for the fiscal year
6 1924, \$210,000.

7 Salaries and expenses of clerks, United States courts:
8 For salaries of clerks of United States circuit courts of
9 appeals and of United States district courts, includ-
10 ing the same objects specified under this head in the Act
11 making appropriations for the Departments of State and
12 Justice and for the judiciary for the fiscal year 1924,
13 \$35,000.

14 Fees of United States commissioners: For fees of
15 United States commissioners and justices of the peace acting
16 under section 1014, Revised Statutes of the United States,
17 \$125,000.

18 Fees of jurors: For fees of jurors, \$250,000.

19 Fees of witnesses: For fees of witnesses and for pay-
20 ment of the actual expenses of witnesses, as provided by sec-
21 tion 850, Revised Statutes of the United States, \$200,000.

22 Miscellaneous expenses, United States courts: For such
23 miscellaneous expenses as may be authorized or approved
24 by the Attorney General, for the United States courts and
25 their officers, including so much as may be necessary in the

1 discretion of the Attorney General for such expenses in the
2 District of Alaska and in courts other than Federal courts,
3 \$35,000.

4 PENAL INSTITUTIONS

5 Support of United States prisoners: For support of
6 United States prisoners, including the same objects specified
7 under this head in the Act making appropriations for the
8 Departments of State and Justice and the judiciary for the
9 fiscal year 1924, \$602,000.
