AMENDMENT

Intended to be proposed by Mr. COPELAND to the bill (H. R. 6820) making appropriations for the Navy Department and the naval service for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1925, and for other purposes, viz: On page 14, line 3, insert after the colon the following:

1 *Provided further,* That, until June 30, 1925, of the
2 Organized Militia as provided by law, such part as may be
3 duly prescribed in any State, Territory, or for the District
4 of Columbia, shall constitute a Naval Militia; and until
5 June 30, 1925, such of the Naval Militia as now is in
6 existence, and as now organized and prescribed by the Sec-
7 retary of the Navy under authority of the Act of Congress
8 approved February 16, 1914, shall be a part of the Naval
9 Reserve Force, and the Secretary of the Navy is authorized

1 to maintain and provide for said Naval Militia as provided
2 in said Act: *Provided*, That upon their enrollment in the
3 Naval Reserve Force, and not otherwise until June 30,
4 1925, the members of said Naval Militia shall have all the
5 benefits, gratuities, privileges, and emoluments provided by
6 law for other members of the Naval Reserve Force; and
7 that, with the approval of the Secretary of the Navy, duty
8 performed in the Naval Militia may be counted as active
9 service for the maintenance of efficiency required by law
10 for members of the Naval Reserve Force.
