Mr. GRIEST introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Post Office and Post Roads and ordered to be printed.

A BILL

Authorizing the Postmaster General to contract for mail messenger service.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That hereafter postmasters may be designated by the Post-
4 master General as disbursing officers for the payment of mail
5 messengers and others engaged under their supervision in
6 transporting the mails: *Provided*, That in the discretion of
7 the Postmaster General, postmasters, assistant postmasters,
8 and clerks at post offices of the third and fourth classes
9 may enter into contracts for the performance of mail mes-
10 senger service, and allowance may be made therefor
11 from the appropriations for mail messenger service: *Pro-*

1 *vided further*, That the total amount payable under such
2 contract to any postmaster, assistant postmaster, or clerk
3 shall not exceed \$300 in any one year: *Provided further*,
4 That hereafter special delivery messengers at post offices
5 of all classes may enter into contracts for mail messenger
6 service.
