A BILL

Authorizing payment to certain Red Lake Indians, out of Chippewa Indian funds, for garden plats surrendered for school-farm use.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the Secretary of the Interior is hereby authorized to
4 withdraw from the Treasury of the United States not to
5 exceed \$1,000, out of moneys on deposit to the credit of the
6 Red Lake Indians in Minnesota, and to use the same, or as
7 much thereof as may be necessary, in reimbursing certain
8 Red Lake Indians whom he may find to have suffered loss

- 1 through the taking of their individual garden plats, without
 2 remuneration to them, for Indian school-farm purposes.

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill authorizing payment to certain Red Lake Indians, out of the tribal trust funds, for garden plats surrendered for school-farm use."
