AN ACT

To amend section 115 of the Act of March 3, 1911, entitled "An Act to codify, revise, and amend the laws relating to the judiciary."

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That section 115 of the Act approved March 3, 1911,
4 entitled "An Act to codify, revise, and amend the laws re-
5 lating to the judiciary," be, and the same is hereby, amended
6 so as to read as follows:

7 "SEC. 115. The State of Wyoming and the Yellow-
8 stone National Park shall constitute one judicial district, to
9 be known as the district of Wyoming. Terms of the district
10 court for said district shall be held at Cheyenne on the
11 second Mondays in May and November, at Casper on the

1 first Monday in February, at Evanston on the second Tues-
2 day in July, and at Lander on the first Monday in October;
3 and the said court shall hold one session annually at Sheridan,
4 and in said national park, on such dates as the court may
5 order. The marshal and clerk of the said court shall each,
6 respectively, appoint at least one deputy to reside at Casper,
7 and one to reside at Evanston, and one to reside at Lander,
8 and shall also maintain an office at each of those places: *Pro-*
9 *vided*, That, until a public building is provided at Casper,
10 suitable accommodations for holding court in said town shall
11 be furnished free of expense to the United States. The
12 marshal of the United States for the said district may appoint
13 one or more deputy marshals for the Yellowstone National
14 Park, who shall reside in said park."
