Mr. DALLINGER, from the committee of conference, submitted the following

CONFERENCE REPORT

[To accompany H. R. 5478]

The committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the amendments of the Senate to the bill (H. R. 5478) providing for the amendment of sections 1, 3, and 6 of an act to provide for the promotion of vocational rehabilitation of persons disabled in industry or otherwise, and their return to civil employment, approved June 2, 1920, having met, after full and free conference, have agreed to recommend and do recommend to their respective Houses as follows:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendments of the Senate numbered 1, 2, 4, and 5, and agree to the same.

Amendment numbered 3:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate numbered 3, and agree to the same with an amendment as follows:

In lieu of the matter inserted insert the following: *June 30, 1926, and June 30, 1927*; and the Senate agree to the same.

Amendment numbered 6:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate numbered 6, and agree to the same with an amendment as follows:

In lieu of the matter stricken out and inserted by said amendment strike out the words "and annually thereafter for a period of three years" and insert in lieu thereof *1926, and 1927*; and the Senate agree to the same.

Amendment numbered 7:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate numbered 7, and agree to the same with an amendment as follows:

In lieu of the matter inserted by said amendment, insert the word *three*; and the Senate agree to the same.
