
IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Mr. SCHALL introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary and ordered to be printed.

A BILL

To incorporate the United States Blind Veterans of the World War.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

8 hereby created and declared to be a body corporate. The
9 name of this corporation shall be "The United States Blind
10 Veterans of the World War."

11 SEC. 2. That said persons named in section 1 are
12 hereby authorized to meet to complete the organization of
13 said corporation by the selection of officers, the adoption of
14 a constitution and by-laws, and to do all other things neces-
15 sary to carry into effect the provisions of this Act.

16 SEC. 3. That the purposes of said corporation are to bind
17 together for their mutual fellowship and assistance those
18 citizens of the United States of America who have served
19 their country in war, and who bear as a mark of such serv-
20 ice the loss of their sight and to perpetuate and keep alive
21 the memories of their comradeship and to enable them by
22 their organization to render what aid they can to the blind
23 in general.

24 SEC. 4. That the corporation created by this Act shall
25 have the following powers: To have perpetual succession

1 with power to sue and be sued in courts of law and equity;
2 to receive, hold, own, use, and dispose of such real estate
3 and personal property as shall be necessary for its corporate
4 purposes; to adopt a corporate seal and alter the same at
5 pleasure; to adopt a constitution, by-laws, and regulations
6 to carry out its purposes, not inconsistent with the laws of
7 the United States or of any State; to use in carrying out
8 the purposes of the corporation such emblems and badges
9 as it may adopt; to establish and maintain offices for the
10 conduct of its business; to establish State and Territorial
11 organizations and local chapter or post organizations; to
12 publish a magazine or other publications, and generally do
13 any and all such acts and things as may be necessary and
14 proper in carrying into effect the purposes of the corporation.

15 SEC. 5. That any honorably discharged American vet-
16 eran of the allied forces who participated in the World War
17 and whose vision has become defective to such an extent
18 that he is eligible for training under Supervisor for the Blind
19 of the United States Veterans' Bureau, and any ex-service
20 man who is eligible for such training shall be eligible for
21 "active membership" in the United States Blind Veterans
22 of the World War. The members of this corporation shall
23 have the power to admit such other persons to "associate"
24 and "honorary" membership as they may see fit.

1 SEC. 6. That this organization shall be nonpolitical and
2 shall not be used for the dissemination of partisan principles.

3 SEC. 7. That said corporation and its State and local
4 subdivisions shall have the sole and exclusive right to have
5 and to use in carrying out its purposes the name "The
6 United States Blind Veterans of the World War."

7 SEC. 8. That the right to repeal, alter, or amend this
8 Act at any time is hereby expressly reserved.
