AN ACT

To authorize an exchange of lands with the State of Washington.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That upon delivery to the Secretary of the Interior by the
4 State of Washington of its properly executed conveyance to
5 the United States of America in fee simple of the following
6 lands in that State: The northwest quarter of the northeast
7 quarter, the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter,
8 the south half of the northwest quarter, the southwest quarter
9 and the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter, all in
10 section 16, township 20 north, range 1 east, Willamette
11 Meridian, containing three hundred and sixty acres, the Sec-
12 retary of the Interior is authorized to issue in exchange
13 therefor a patent to the State of Washington to the follow-

1 ing lands in that State: The north half of the northwest
2 quarter, the east half of the southwest quarter of the north-
3 west quarter, the east half of the northwest quarter of the
4 southwest quarter, all in section 25, township 22 north,
5 range 10 west, Willamette Meridian.

6 SEC. 2. That the lands first described shall as soon as
7 title thereto is vested in the United States be under the care
8 and control of the Attorney General of the United States,
9 to be administered by him as a part of the Federal peni-
10 tentiary on McNeil Island.
