

IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

JANUARY 12, 1924.

Mr. JOHNSON of Washington introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Public Lands and ordered to be printed.

**A BILL**

To authorize an exchange of lands with the State of Washington.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3        That upon delivery to the Secretary of the Interior by the  
4        State of Washington of its properly executed conveyance to  
5        the United States of America in fee simple of the following  
6        lands in that State: The northwest quarter of the northeast  
7        quarter, the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter,  
8        the south half of the northwest quarter, the south-  
9        west quarter and the northwest quarter of the southeast  
10       quarter, all in section 16, township 20 north, range 1 east,  
11       Willamette Meridian, containing three hundred and sixty  
12       acres, the Secretary of the Interior is authorized to issue in  
13       exchange therefor a patent to the State of Washington to the  
14       following lands in that State: The north half of the north-  
15       west quarter, the east half of the southwest quarter of the  
16       northwest quarter, the east half of the northwest quarter of

1 the southwest quarter, all in section 25, township 22 north,  
2 range 10 west, Willamette Meridian.

3 SEC. 2. That the lands first described shall as soon as  
4 title thereto is vested in the United States be under the care  
5 and control of the Attorney General of the United States,  
6 to be administered by him as a part of the Federal peni-  
7 tentiary on McNeil Island.
