A BILL

Authorizing the Secretary of War to sell a portion of the Carlisle Barracks Reservation.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 That the transfer from the Department of the Interior to the
4 War Department of the control and jurisdiction over the
5 parcels known as farm numbered 1, farm numbered 2, and
6 the Sanno tract, now constituting a part of the Govern-
7 ment reservation at Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, is rat-
8 ified and confirmed.

9 SEC. 2. The Secretary of War is authorized to sell
10 at either public or private sale, upon terms and condi-

1 tions deemed advisable by him, the land lying north of the
2 Carlisle-Harrisburg Highway, being part of the tract of land
3 known as farm numbered 2, constituting a part of the Car-
4 lisle Barracks Reservation, the land to be sold as a whole or in
5 parcels as the Secretary of War may determine, and to exe-
6 cute and deliver in the name of the United States and in its
7 behalf any and all deeds or other instruments necessary to
8 effect such sale.

9 SEC. 3. For the acquisition of the additional land
10 needed at the post of Carlisle Barracks for the use of the
11 medical field service school an appropriation of \$10,000 is
12 authorized.

13 SEC. 3. *The Secretary of War is authorized to acquire*
14 *by negotiation or appropriate condemnation proceedings ad-*
15 *ditional land needed at the post of Carlisle Barracks for the*
16 *use of the Medical Field Service School, to wit: The so-called*
17 *Alexander tract, being a triangular parcel of ground lying*
18 *to the southeastward of the original reservation and between*
19 *said original reservation, the said farm numbered 1, and the*
20 *Cumberland Valley Railway, comprising nineteen and six-*
21 *tenths acres, more or less; and the so-called Henderson tract,*
22 *being an irregular parcel of ground lying northwestward*
23 *of the original reservation and the said farm numbered 1,*
24 *and southeastward of the Carlisle-Harrisburg Highway,*
25 *comprising thirty-four acres, more or less: Provided, That*

1 *the proceeds realized from the sale authorized by section 2 of*
2 *this Act of the part of farm numbered 2 therein described*
3 *may be applied toward the acquisition of the said Alexander*
4 *and Henderson tracts: And provided further, That any resi-*
5 *due of the proceeds of the said sale not required to pay for*
6 *the acquisition of the said tracts under the provisions of this*
7 *Act shall be deposited in the Treasury as miscellaneous*
8 *receipts.*
