AN ACT

Granting the consent of Congress to the Delaware State Highway Department to construct a bridge across the canal near Rehoboth, Delaware

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the consent of Congress is hereby granted to the Dela-
4 ware State Highway Department and its successors and
5 assigns, to construct, maintain, and operate a bridge and the
6 approaches thereto across the canal between Rehoboth Bay
7 and the Delaware Bay, being a part of an inland waterway,
8 partly natural and partly artificial, from Chincoteague Bay
9 to Delaware Bay, at a point suitable to the interests of navi-
10 gation, at or near Rehoboth, in the county of Sussex, in the

1 State of Delaware, in accordance with the provisions of the
2 Act entitled, "An Act to regulate the construction of bridges
3 over navigable waters," approved March 23, 1906: *Pro-*
4 *vided*, That the Secretary of War is hereby authorized, upon
5 the recommendation of the Chief of Engineers, United States
6 Army, to grant permission to the said Delaware State High-
7 way Department, its successors and assigns, under such
8 terms and conditions as the said Secretary may deem equi-
9 table and fair to the public, to cross and occupy such public
10 lands pertinent to the United States Canal as may be neces-
11 sary for the bridge and approaches thereto.

12 SEC. 2. That the right to alter, amend, or repeal this
13 Act is hereby expressly reserved.
