## AN ACT

To perfect the title of purchasers of Indian lands sold under the provisions of the Act of Congress of March 3, 1909 (Thirty-fifth Statutes at Large, page 751), and the regulations pursuant thereto as applied to Indians of the Quapaw Agency.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That in all cases where lands allotted to members of any of  
4       the tribes belonging to the Quapaw Agency in Oklahoma are  
5       held under a trust or other patent containing restrictions on  
6       alienation, and said restrictions have been or shall hereafter  
7       be removed by order of the Secretary of the Interior pursu-  
8       ant to the Act of March 3, 1909 (Thirty-fifth Statutes at  
9       Large, page 751), or said lands or any portion thereof have  
10      been or shall hereafter be sold by said allottee or his heirs

1 under the regulations of the Secretary of the Interior pur-  
2 suant to said Act, the deed of such allottee or his heirs exe-  
3 cuted after the removal of such restrictions, or when ap-  
4 proved by the Secretary of the Interior, shall convey full  
5 title to the lands or interest so sold the same as if a fee simple  
6 patent without restrictions had been issued to the allottee:  
7 *Provided*, That nothing in this Act shall be construed to  
8 apply to the lands of the Kaw or Osage Indians, or to lands  
9 of Indians of the Five Civilized Tribes in Oklahoma.

Passed the House of Representatives June 2, 1924.
