A BILL

To authorize the State of Alabama, through its highway department, to construct and maintain a bridge across the Coosa River, at or near Leesburg, Alabama, connecting Leesburg, Alabama, and Center, Alabama, on the primary road system of the State

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 *That the consent of Congress is hereby granted to the State*
4 *of Alabama, through its highway department, is hereby*
5 ~~authorized~~ *to construct and maintain a bridge and ap-*
6 *proaches thereto across the Coosa River, at a point suitable*
7 *to the interests of navigation, at or near Leesburg, Ala-*
8 *bama, connecting Leesburg, Alabama, and Center, Ala-*

1 bama, on the primary road system of the State, in accord-
2 ance with the provisions of the Act entitled "An Act to
3 regulate the construction of bridges over navigable waters,"
4 approved March 23, 1906.

5 SEC. 2. That the right to alter, amend, or repeal this
6 Act is hereby expressly reserved.

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill granting the
consent of Congress to the State of Alabama, through its
highway department, to construct and maintain a bridge
across the Coosa River at or near Leesburg, Alabama."
