AN ACT

To extend the provisions of certain laws to the Territory of Hawaii.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That beginning with the fiscal year ending June 30, 1925,
4 the Territory of Hawaii shall be entitled to share in appro-
5 priations now or which may hereafter become available for
6 apportionment under the Act entitled "An Act to provide
7 that the United States shall aid the States in the construction
8 of rural post roads, and for other purposes," approved July
9 11, 1916, or the Federal Highway Act, or any Act amend-
10 atory thereof or supplementary thereto, upon the same
11 terms and conditions as any of the several States, and such

1 Territory shall be included in the calculations to determine
2 the basis of apportionment of such funds: *Provided*, That in
3 approving road projects in such Territory to receive Federal
4 aid, the Secretary of Agriculture shall give preference to
5 such projects as will expedite the completion of an adequate
6 system of highways for the national defense or which will
7 connect seaports with units of the national parks.

8 SEC. 2. Subject to the approval of the Federal Farm
9 Loan Board and under such conditions as it may prescribe,
10 the provisions of the Federal Farm Loan Act, as amended,
11 are extended to the Territory of Hawaii. Such board shall
12 include the Territory in a Federal land bank district, and
13 such Federal land bank as the board may designate is au-
14 thorized to establish branch banks in the Territory.

15 SEC. 3. The Territory of Hawaii shall be entitled to
16 share in the benefits of the Act entitled "An Act for the
17 promotion of the welfare and hygiene of maternity and
18 infancy, and for other purposes," approved November 23,
19 1921, or any Act amendatory thereof or supplementary
20 thereto, upon the same terms and conditions as any of the
21 several States. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1925,
22 there is authorized to be appropriated, out of any money in
23 the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$13,000,
24 to be available for apportionment under such Act to the
25 Territory, and annually thereafter such sum as would be

1 apportioned to the Territory if such Act had originally in-
2 cluded the Territory.

3 SEC. 4. The Territory of Hawaii shall be entitled to
4 share in the benefits of the Act entitled "An Act to provide
5 for the promotion of vocational education; to provide for
6 cooperation with the States in the promotion of such educa-
7 tion in agriculture and the trades and industries; to provide
8 for cooperation with the States in the preparation of teachers
9 of vocational subjects; and to appropriate money and regu-
10 late its expenditure," approved February 23, 1917, or any
11 Act amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, upon
12 the same terms and conditions as any of the several States.
13 There is authorized to be appropriated, out of any money
14 in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the
15 fiscal year ending June 30, 1925, and annually thereafter,
16 the sum of \$30,000, to be available for allotment under such
17 Act to the Territory.

18 SEC. 5. The Territory of Hawaii shall be entitled to
19 share in the benefits of the Act entitled "An Act to provide
20 for the promotion of vocational rehabilitation of persons dis-
21 abled in industry or otherwise and their return to civil em-
22 ployment," approved June 2, 1920, or any Act amendatory
23 thereof or supplementary thereto, upon the same terms and
24 conditions as any of the several States. There is authorized
25 to be appropriated, out of any money in the Treasury not

1 otherwise appropriated, for the fiscal year ending June 30,
2 1925, and annually thereafter, the sum of \$5,000, to be
3 available for allotment under such Act to the Territory.
