AN ACT

Granting the consent of Congress for the construction of a bridge across the Saint John River between Fort Kent, Maine, and Clairs, Province of New Brunswick, Canada.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the consent of Congress is hereby granted for the con-
4 struction, maintenance, and operation by the State of Maine
5 and the Dominion of Canada, jointly, of a bridge to be
6 erected across the Saint John River, at a point suitable to
7 the interests of navigation, between Fort Kent, Maine, and
8 Clairs, Province of New Brunswick, Canada, in accordance
9 with the provisions of the Act entitled "An Act to regulate
10 the construction of bridges over navigable waters," approved
11 March 23, 1906: *Provided*, That the construction of said

1 bridge shall not be commenced until the consent of the proper
2 authorities of the Dominion of Canada for the erection of the
3 structure shall have been obtained.

4 SEC. 2. That the right to alter, amend, or repeal this
5 Act is hereby expressly reserved.
