Mr. HERSEY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce and ordered to be printed.

**A BILL**

For the construction of a bridge across the Saint John River between Fort Kent, Maine, and Clairs, Province of New Brunswick, Canada.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3        That the consent of Congress is hereby given to the con-  
4        struction, maintenance, and operation by the State of Maine  
5        and the Dominion of Canada, jointly, of a highway bridge  
6        to be erected across the Saint John River, at a point suit-  
7        able to the interests of navigation, between Fort Kent,  
8        Maine, and Clairs, Province of New Brunswick, Canada, in  
9        accordance with the provisions of the Act entitled "An  
10       Act to regulate the construction of bridges over navigable  
11       waters," approved March 23, 1906: *Provided*, That the  
12       construction of said bridge shall not be commenced until

1 the consent of the proper authorities of the Dominion of  
2 Canada for the erection of the structure shall have been  
3 obtained.

4 SEC. 2. That the right to alter, amend, or repeal this  
5 Act is hereby expressly reserved.
