AN ACT

Authorizing an appropriation for the construction of a road within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That there is hereby authorized an appropriation of \$50,000
4 from any tribal funds on deposit in the Treasury to the
5 credit of the Indians of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation,
6 Arizona, during the year 1925, and \$50,000 from any like
7 funds during the year 1926—in all, \$100,000—to remain
8 available until expended, to pay one-half the cost of con-
9 structing a wagon road between Cooley and Whiteriver,
10 within said reservation: *Provided,* That no part of the appro-
11 priations herein authorized shall be expended until the Sec-

1 retary of the Interior shall have obtained from the proper
2 authorities of the State of Arizona satisfactory guaranties
3 of the payment of one-half of the cost of the construction of
4 said road or of one-half of the cost of such part thereof as
5 may be constructed in any year.

6 SEC. 2. There is hereby authorized an appropriation of
7 \$10,000 from any tribal funds on deposit in the Treasury to
8 the credit of the Indians of the Fort Apache Indian Reser-
9 vation, Arizona, for the construction of a suitable building,
10 including fireproof vault, heating and ventilating apparatus,
11 for the use and accommodation of the United States Indian
12 Agency at Whiteriver, on said reservation.
