
IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Mr. HAYDEN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs and ordered to be printed.

A BILL

Authorizing an appropriation for the construction of a road within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That there is hereby authorized an appropriation of \$50,000
4 from any tribal funds on deposit in the Treasury to the
5 credit of the Indians of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation,
6 Arizona, during the year 1924, and \$50,000 from any like
7 funds during the year 1925—in all, \$100,000—to remain
8 available until expended, to pay one-half the cost of con-
9 structing a wagon road between Cooley and Whiteriver,
10 within said reservation: *Provided*, That no part of the appro-
11 priations herein authorized shall be expended until the Sec-
12 retary of the Interior shall have obtained from the proper

1 authorities of the State of Arizona satisfactory guaranties
2 of the payment of one-half of the cost of the construction of
3 said road or of one-half of the cost of such part thereof as
4 may be constructed in any year.

5 SEC. 2. There is hereby authorized an appropriation of
6 \$10,000 from any tribal funds on deposit in the Treasury to
7 the credit of the Indians of the Fort Apache Indian Reser-
8 vation, Arizona, to be immediately available, for the con-
9 struction of a suitable building, including fireproof vault,
10 heating and ventilating apparatus, for the use and accommo-
11 dation of the United States Indian Agency at Whiteriver,
12 on said reservation.
