## A BILL

To amend section 84 of the Penal Code of the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled.*

3 That section 84 of the Act entitled "An Act to codify,  
4 revise, and amend the penal laws of the United States,"  
5 approved March 4, 1909 (Thirty-fourth Statutes, page  
6 1088), be, and the same is hereby, amended so as to read  
7 as follows:

8 SEC. 84. Whoever shall hunt, trap, capture, willfully  
9 disturb, or kill any bird or wild animal of any kind whatever,  
10 or take or destroy the eggs of any such bird on any lands of  
11 the United States which have been set apart or reserved as  
12 refuges or breeding grounds for such birds or animals by  
13 any law, proclamation, or Executive order, except under such

1 rules and regulations as the Secretary of Agriculture may,  
2 from time to time, prescribe, or who shall willfully injure,  
3 molest, or destroy any property of the United States on  
4 any such lands shall be fined not more than \$500, or im-  
5 prisoned not more than six months, or both."
