A BILL

Making supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 *That the following sums are appropriated out of any money*
4 *in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to supply supple-*
5 *mental appropriations (this Act may be cited as the "Sup-*
6 *plemental Appropriations Act, 1974") for the fiscal year*

16 after be adjusted in accordance with 5 U.S.C. 5307.

9 **ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS FUND**

10 In addition to the amount available for obligation in
11 this account for the current fiscal year from funds made avail-
12 able to General Services Administration from any source
13 except obligations for reimbursable work performed for other
14 agencies under section 601 of the Economy Act of 1932,
15 as amended (31 U.S.C. 686), \$1,000,000 shall also be
16 available for such obligation.

17 **CHAPTER X**18 **CLAIMS AND JUDGMENTS**

19 For payment of claims settled and determined by depart-
20 ments and agencies in accord with law and judgments ren-
21 dered against the United States by the United States Court
22 of Claims and United States district courts, as set forth in
23 House Documents Numbered 93-163 and 93-179, Ninety-
24 third Congress, \$47,011,168, together with such amounts
25 as may be necessary to pay interest (as and when specified

1 in such judgments or provided by law) and such additional
2 sums due to increases in rates of exchange as may be neces-
3 sary to pay claims in foreign currency: *Provided*, That no
4 judgment herein appropriated for shall be paid until it shall
5 become final and conclusive against the United States by
6 failure of the parties to appeal or otherwise: *Provided fur-*
7 *ther*, That unless otherwise specifically required by law or
8 by the judgment, payment of interest wherever appropriated
9 for herein shall not continue for more than thirty days after
10 the date of approval of the Act.

11 CHAPTER XI

12 GENERAL PROVISIONS

13 SEC. 1101. No part of any appropriation contained in
14 this Act shall remain available for obligation beyond the
15 current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein.

16 SEC. 1102. No part of any appropriation under this Act
17 shall be available to the Secretaries of the Interior and Agri-
18 culture for use for any sale hereafter made of unprocessed
19 timber from Federal lands west of the 100th meridian which
20 will be exported from the United States, or which will be
21 used as a substitute for timber from private lands which is
22 exported by the purchaser.
