Mr. SCARBOROUGH submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was considered and agreed to

## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for an adjournment of the two Houses.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring)*, That when the House adjourns on the legisla-  
3 tive day of Thursday, February 16, 1995, it stand ad-  
4 journed until 12:30 p.m. on Tuesday, February 21, 1995,  
5 or until noon on the second day after Members are notified  
6 to reassemble pursuant to section 2 of this concurrent res-  
7 olution, whichever occurs first; and that when the Senate  
8 recesses or adjourns at the close of business on Thursday,  
9 February 16, 1995, pursuant to a motion made by the  
10 majority leader or his designee, in accordance with this  
11 resolution, it stand recessed or adjourned until noon, or  
12 at such time on that day as may be specified by the major-  
13 ity leader or his designee in the motion to recess or ad-

1 jour, on Wednesday, February 22, 1995, or until noon  
2 on the second day after Members are notified to reassem-  
3 ble pursuant to section 2 of this concurrent resolution,  
4 whichever occurs first.

5       SEC. 2. The Speaker of the House and the majority  
6 leader of the Senate, acting jointly after consultation with  
7 the minority leader of the House and the minority leader  
8 of the Senate, shall notify the Members of the House and  
9 Senate, respectively, to reassemble whenever, in their opin-  
10 ion, the public interest shall warrant it.
