Mr. DAN SCHAEFER of Colorado (for himself, Mr. HEFLEY, Mr. MCINNIS, and Mr. BOB SCHAFFER) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on House Oversight

## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for acceptance of a statue of Jack Swigert, presented by the State of Colorado, for placement in National Statuary Hall, and for other purposes.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring)*, That (a) the statue of Jack Swigert, fur-  
3 nished by the State of Colorado for placement in National  
4 Statuary Hall in accordance with section 1814 of the Re-  
5 vised Statutes of the United States (40 U.S.C. 187), is  
6 accepted in the name of the United States, and the thanks  
7 of the Congress are tendered to the State of Colorado for  
8 providing this commemoration of one of its most eminent  
9 personages.

1 (b) The State of Colorado is authorized to use the  
2 rotunda of the Capitol on May 22, 1997, at 11 o'clock,  
3 ante meridiem, for a presentation ceremony for the statue.  
4 The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board  
5 shall take such action as may be necessary with respect  
6 to physical preparations and security for the ceremony.

7 (c) The statue shall be displayed in the rotunda of  
8 the Capitol for a period of not more than six months, after  
9 which period the statue shall be moved to its permanent  
10 location in National Statuary Hall.

11 SEC. 2. The transcript of proceedings of the cere-  
12 mony shall be printed, under the direction of the Joint  
13 Committee on the Library, as a House document, with il-  
14 lustrations and suitable binding. In addition to the usual  
15 number, there shall be printed 6,555 copies of the docu-  
16 ment, of which 450 copies shall be for the use of the  
17 House of Representatives, 105 copies shall be for the use  
18 of the Senate, 3,500 copies shall be for the use of the Rep-  
19 resentatives from Colorado, and 2,500 copies shall be for  
20 the use of the Senators from Colorado.

21 SEC. 3. The Clerk of the House of Representatives  
22 shall transmit a copy of this concurrent resolution to the  
23 Governor of Colorado.
