## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

For the approval of regulations of the Office of Compliance under the Congressional Accountability Act of 1995 relating to the application of chapter 71 of title 5, United States Code.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2        *concurring),*

3        **SECTION 1. APPROVAL.**

4        The following regulations issued by the Office of  
5        Compliance on August 16, 1996, are hereby approved:

1 **“§ 2472 Specific regulations regarding certain offices**  
2 **of Congress**

3 **“§ 2472.1 Purpose and scope**

4 “The regulations contained in this section implement  
5 the provisions of chapter 71 as applied by section 220 of  
6 the CAA to covered employees in the following employing  
7 offices:

8 “(A) the personal office of any Member of the  
9 House of Representatives or of any Senator;

10 “(B) a standing select, special, permanent, tem-  
11 porary, or other committee of the Senate or House  
12 of Representatives, or a joint committee of Congress;

13 “(C) the Office of the Vice President (as Presi-  
14 dent of the Senate), the Office of the President pro  
15 tempore of the Senate, the Office of the Majority  
16 Leader of the Senate, the Office of the Minority  
17 Leader of the Senate, the Office of the Majority  
18 Whip of the Senate, the Office of the Minority Whip  
19 of the Senate, the Conference of the Majority of the  
20 Senate, the Conference of the Minority of the Sen-  
21 ate, the Office of the Secretary of the Conference of  
22 the Majority of the Senate, the Office of the Sec-  
23 retary of the Conference of the Minority of the Sen-  
24 ate, the Office of the Secretary for the Majority of  
25 the Senate, the Office of the Secretary for the Mi-  
26 nority of the Senate, the Majority Policy Committee

1 of the Senate, the Minority Policy Committee of the  
2 Senate, and the following offices within the Office of  
3 the Secretary of the Senate: Offices of the Par-  
4 liamentarian, Bill Clerk, Legislative Clerk, Journal  
5 Clerk, Executive Clerk, Enrolling Clerk, Official Re-  
6 porters of Debate, Daily Digest, Printing Services,  
7 Captioning Services, and Senate Chief Counsel for  
8 Employment;

9 “(D) the Office of the Speaker of the House of  
10 Representatives, the Office of the Majority Leader of  
11 the House of Representatives, the Office of the Mi-  
12 nority Leader of the House of Representatives, the  
13 Offices of the Chief Deputy Majority Whips, the Of-  
14 fices of the Chief Deputy Minority Whips, and the  
15 following offices within the Office of the Clerk of the  
16 House of Representatives: Offices of Legislative Op-  
17 erations, Official Reporters of Debate, Official Re-  
18 porters to Committees, Printing Services, and Legis-  
19 lative Information;

20 “(E) the Office of the Legislative Counsel of  
21 the Senate, the Office of the Senate Legal Counsel,  
22 the Office of the Legislative Counsel of the House  
23 of Representatives, the Office of the General Counsel  
24 of the House of Representatives, the Office of the

1       Parliamentarian of the House of Representatives,  
2       and the Office of the Law Revision Counsel;

3               “(F) the offices of any caucus or party organi-  
4       zation;

5               “(G) the Congressional Budget Office, the Of-  
6       fice of Technology Assessment, and the Office of  
7       Compliance; and

8               “(H) the Executive Office of the Secretary of  
9       the Senate, the Office of Senate Security, the Senate  
10      Disbursing Office, the Administrative Office of the  
11      Sergeant at Arms of the Senate, the Office of the  
12      Majority Whip of the House of Representatives, the  
13      Office of the Minority Whip of the House of Rep-  
14      resentatives, the Office of House Employment Coun-  
15      sel, the Immediate Office of the Clerk of the House  
16      of Representatives, the Immediate Office of the  
17      Chief Administrative Officer of the House of Rep-  
18      resentatives, the Office of Legislative Computer Sys-  
19      tems of the House of Representatives, the Office of  
20      Finance of the House of Representatives, and the  
21      Immediate Office of the Sergeant at Arms of the  
22      House of Representatives.

1 **“§ 2472.2 Application of chapter 71**

2       “(a) The requirements and exemptions of chapter 71  
3 of title 5, United States Code, as made applicable by sec-  
4 tion 220 of the CAA, shall apply to covered employees who  
5 are employed in the offices listed in section 2472.1 in the  
6 same manner and to the same extent as those require-  
7 ments and exemptions are applied to other covered em-  
8 ployees.

9       “(b) The regulations of the Office, as set forth at sec-  
10 tions 2420–29 and 2470–71, shall apply to the employing  
11 offices listed in section 2472.1, covered employees who are  
12 employed in those offices and representatives of those em-  
13 ployees.”
