The following list includes the President's public schedule and other items of general interest announced by the Office of the Press Secretary and not included elsewhere in this book.

August 1

In the morning, the President traveled to Jersey City, NJ, where he met with families from the State to discuss their problems with the health care system. In the late afternoon, he returned to Washington, DC.

August 2

In the evening, the President and Hillary Clinton attended a Democratic National Committee fundraiser at a private residence in Oxon Hill, MD.

The President declared major disasters in Oregon and Washington following severe damage to the ocean salmon fishing industries caused by the El Niño weather pattern and recent drought.

The White House announced that the President has invited President Leonid Kuchma of Ukraine to Washington, DC, for an official working visit on November 29.

The President announced his intention to appoint Dolores Kohl as a member of the White House Commission on Presidential Scholars.

The President announced his intention to appoint Kit Dobbelle as a member of the White House Commission on Presidential Scholars.

August 4

The President announced his intention to nominate Herschelle Challenor to the National Security Education Board.

The President announced his intention to nominate Sheldon C. (Shay) Bilchik as Administrator of the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention at the Department of Justice.

August 5

In the afternoon, the President and Hillary and Chelsea Clinton went to Camp David, MD.

The President announced his intention to nominate Kenneth Spencer Yalowitz as Ambassador to Belarus.

The President announced his intention to appoint Joseph M. Aragon, Stephen R. Colgate, and Kenneth Young as members of the Board of Directors of Federal Prison Industries.

August 6

In the afternoon, the President traveled from Camp David, MD, to Detroit, MI, where he attended the "Michigan Salutes the President" dinner. He returned to Camp David in the evening.

August 8

In the morning, the President and Hillary and Chelsea Clinton returned to Washington, DC. Later in the morning, the President met with the Law Enforcement Steering Committee.

The President announced his intention to nominate Vincent Sorrentino to be a member of the Advisory Board of the Saint Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation at the Department of Transportation.

August 9

In the morning, the President met with business leaders to discuss health care reform.

The President announced his intention to appoint Jorge Perez to the National Council on the Arts.

The White House announced that the President has directed that the Deputy Secretary of Defense and the Director of Central Intelligence conduct an immediate inquiry into the National Reconnaissance Office headquarters construction project and that the project be declassified.
